



'I was Ryan's slave'

■ Ex-lover of United legend Giggs shocks court with details of years-long 'toxic relationship'

THE EX-LOVER of Manchester United footballer Ryan Giggs told a court this week she became his slave as their toxic relationship spiralled.

Giving evidence on the third day of Giggs's assault trial on Wednesday, Kate Greville said he exerted control over her social life and the end of their six-year relationship was "pretty much relentlessly awful".

She told jurors that the former Wales manager "made me feel like I had to do what he said, otherwise there were consequences".

Prosecutor Peter Wright had earlier told the jury at Minshull Street Crown Court in Manchester that while Giggs' soccer skills were a thing of beauty, his off-field life was very different.

'litany of abuse'

"In the privacy of his own personal life at home or behind closed doors, there was, we say the facts reveal, a much uglier and more sinister side to his character," Wright told the jury. "This was a private life that involved a litany of abuse, both physical and psychological, of a

woman he professed to love."

Giggs, 48, denies using controlling and coercive behaviour against Greville, 36, between August 2017 and November 2020, assaulting her, causing actual bodily harm, and the common assault of her younger sister, Emma.

Earlier, the Court heard the former Wales winger had cheated on her with eight women over six years.

'sex bruise'

While being cross-examined by Giggs's barrister Chris Daw QC, Ms Greville said that when the businessman and ex-player told her to do something - she would do it.

Yesterday she said she felt like "a slave to his every need and every demand. That is what it felt like. When Ryan said do something, I would do it.

"There was resistance but he made me feel I had to do what he said, otherwise there would

be consequences."

She denied bruising that she claimed was caused by the Old Trafford legend was actually from "rough sex".

Ms Greville told the jury Giggs pulled her naked from a Dubai hotel bed, onto the floor and across the suite before he threw her belongings into the corridor.

The court heard that Ms Greville told a friend who noticed her bruise from Dubai in September 2017 that it was caused by "rough sex".

When quizzed by Giggs's barrister about why she had not said anything about an assault, the PR executive said it was because "I was embarrassed and didn't want to admit it".

The court also heard about a message she sent to Giggs saying her "sex bruise is coming along nicely".

In another she wrote: "I want you so badly rough" to which Giggs replied: "I'm scared of

hurting you."

When her then-boyfriend sent pictures of sex toys including handcuffs saying: "You asked me to be a bit more assertive", she replied: "Amazing."

The PR worker said they first had sex in December 2014 at a hotel and she left her husband the following February.

The court heard police wanted Ms Greville to hand over her phone as part of their investigations but she told them she lost it at the end of last year

Benin Bronzes returned by museum - could the Elgin Marbles be next?

Watershed decision to return looted artefacts to Africa could be just the beginning

A watershed decision by a museum to return looted African artefacts has raised the prospect that other antiquities including the Elgin Marbles could soon be on their way home too.

The Horniman Museum in south-east London will hand back its 72 Benin Bronzes, held in Britain for more than a century, after a unanimous decision by trustees.

The sculptures, created from at least the 16th century onwards in the West African Kingdom, were among thousands taken during the British assault on Benin City in 1897.

The move is the first by a UK government-funded museum to say it will give back its haul from Benin,

which is now in Edo state, Nigeria.

And it raises questions about the future of objects held in other collections, not least the disputed Elgin Marbles at the British Museum. Dr Nick Merriman, Horniman chief executive, said the collection will be transferred to Nigeria after a request from its government.

The move followed consultation with museum members, local Nigerians, independent experts and even youngsters. Dr Merriman said: "Quite a few children wrote to us. They all felt, in the way that small children are very clear about morals, they should be returned."

Roger Michel, from the Institute for Digital

Archaeology which has made unauthorized copies of the Elgin Marbles, said: "These are things that have special meaning to these cultures. They need to go back. This is a real turning point."

Arts minister Lord Parkinson said it was not up to the Government to "tell museums what a right or wrong decision is". He said any claims should be made "case by case, item by item".

But the Arts Council England has published restitution claim guidance, saying that institutions should consider "the right thing to do" and be transparent. So far the UK has returned two Benin Bronzes from Cambridge University's Jesus College and Aberdeen University,

when it fell in a river. Later another phone went missing when she was mugged.

She was told data could be retrieved from iCloud but she did not want details of her business revealed. Giggs's lawyer said:

"You were worried there was material on the phone that would discredit you as a witness."

However, she replied: "Comments that might have made it look like something it was not."

Ms Greville was asked about sex videos the couple made and an email from Giggs titled Blackmail with a video clip.

This was sent after the pair rowed and Ms Greville had blocked him on WhatsApp. She told police she suspected the attachment was "one of our videos that we had done".

She said she did not view the attachment, saying: "It could have been something funny, but it could have been a sexual video."

The case continues.

Olivia Newton-John dead at 73

Tributes flow for Grease Legend and multi-platinum selling singer

GREASE legend and multi-platinum selling singer Dame Olivia Newton-John has died aged 73.

Her husband John Easterling said the British-born actress passed away Monday with her family and friends at her side.

She was first diagnosed with breast cancer in 1992. It returned in 2013, and again in 2017 when it was at stage four.

Her Grease co-star John Travolta led tributes to her, writing online: "My dearest Olivia, you made all of our lives so much better. Your impact was incredible. I love you so much."

"We will see you down the road and we will all be together again. Yours from the first moment I saw you and forever!"

"Your Danny, your John!"

Newton-John shot to

international, lifelong fame when she played high school student Sandy opposite Travolta as Danny Zuko in Grease in 1978.

She carried on performing despite later cancer diagnoses but also became well-known for advocating research into plant-based treatments for the disease.

triumphs and hope

Mr Easterling posted: "Dame Olivia Newton-John (73) passed away peacefully at her Ranch in Southern California this morning, surrounded by family and friends."

"We ask that everyone please respect the family's privacy."

"Olivia has been a symbol of triumphs and hope for over 30 years sharing her journey with breast cancer. Her healing inspiration and

pioneering experience with plant medicine continues with the Olivia Newton-John Foundation Fund, dedicated to researching plant medicine and cancer."

Olivia was born in Cambridge to Welsh Professor Brin Newton-John and his German wife Irene - daughter of Nobel Prize-winning physicist Max Born.

The youngest of three children, she moved with her family to Melbourne when she was five.

By her mid-teens she was a budding star, having formed girl group Sol Four with classmates at the age of 14, later winning a talent contest on Australian TV show Sing, Sing, Sing - earning a trip to the UK.

Her hits started in 1971 with songs including If Not for You, Let Me Be There (1973) and top-

selling Have You Never Been Mellow in 1975.

In 1974, Olivia had represented her native UK at the Eurovision Song Contest in Brighton with the song Long Live Love.

She came in fourth place in the year that future supergroup Abba won with Waterloo.

In 1984 she married actor Matt Lattanzi and they had daughter Chloe Rose two years later. They divorced in 1995.

In 2008, Olivia wed businessman and conservationist John Easterling. This week he

appealed to her fans for donations to be made to her foundation in lieu of flowers.

Chloe Lattanzi - also a singer and actress - had posted a loving tribute to her mother on Instagram just three days ago, writing: "I worship this woman. My mother. My best friend."

The soundtrack to Grease is one of the world's best-selling albums of recorded music.

It features the two hit duets from the superstar and Travolta - Summer Nights plus You're The

One That I Want.

The latter also ranks as one of the top-selling singles of all time.

Olivia was nominated for many awards including two Golden Globes and several film accolades.

After being diagnosed with breast cancer, she became a leading advocate for research into the disease and its treatments.

Her efforts in the field, and in entertainment, were recognised by the Queen, who made her a Dame in 2020's New Year's Honours list.

Oz mourns its lost sweetheart

It's no wonder that Hollywood is mourning her and that tributes have come from her star friends from Britain as well.

But Australia has and will always claim her as its "darling" and "sweetheart".

Down Under is where she started her musical career, even though she grew up wanting to be a vet and then a policewoman.

Newton-John formed a girl group with three other school friends at 14 and started performing in a café run by her sister's boyfriend.

Australians grew up with a young Olivia Newton-John on their screens.

She appeared on many talent shows. She sang Summertime aged 15 on a televised talent competition and landed

Climate change: UK facing “scary” and “uncharted waters” says expert

■ Droughts and searing heatwaves expected to become a fixture in coming years

THE country's top meteorologist has warned the UK is entering “scary” and “uncharted waters” with searing heatwaves a regular feature of the weather forecasts.

As expectations grew that an official drought will be declared within days, Met Office boss Paul Davies said he feared 95F (35C) heatwaves – like the one baking Britain this week – could start to happen once every five years. He said they could even become an annual event by the end of the century. And temperatures of 104.5F (40.3C), like those recorded in Britain last month, could also start to be seen every seven years.

‘quite scary’

Talking about the changes to our climate and the “brutal” record-breaking high experienced in Lincolnshire on July 19, Mr Davies said: “I knew it was possible but to see it unfold in reality is

quite scary. “When I started as a forecaster, if someone had said, ‘In your lifetime you’ll see 40 degrees’, I’d have said; ‘No, surely not!’

“We are in uncharted waters. We’re entering areas we’ve never experienced before and it’s not just the UK, it’s the planet as a whole.”

The highest temperature recorded this week was in Wiggonholt, West Sussex, at 31.8C (89.2F).

But at press time the Met Office issued an amber “extreme heat” warning in place that will last until Sunday, with temperatures expected to hit 91F (33C). The National Drought Group – consisting of water firms, government representatives and charities – will meet to discuss emergency measures in response.

According to the Environment Agency, an official drought means water companies should impose restrictions on both non-essential

domestic and commercial water use.

Most have so far avoided hosepipe bans but a lack of rainfall and a heatwave this week could force them to introduce the measures.

‘very dry autumn’

Environment Secretary George Eustice this week met water company bosses to discuss their response to the prolonged dry weather – and what they are doing to safeguard supplies.

He said: “I met the chief executives to discuss the measures they are taking...in what is the driest summer in over 50 years. All water companies have reassured me that water supplies remain resilient across the country. Each company has a pre-agreed drought plan which they are following.

“We will continue to actively monitor the situation.” Reservoirs across Britain are looking increasingly depleted. There was not a drop to be seen at The Elan Valley, in mid Wales which looked more like a rocky desert. Levels also appeared

Probed: police inquiry which wrongly implicated trio

Sir Cliff Richard, Paul Gambaccini and Neil Fox are to feature in a new documentary exploring the impact of a police probe that falsely accused them of historical sex offences.

The singer and radio DJs were all investigated but cleared as part of Operation Yewtree and one of its subsequent inquiries. The probes were launched 10 years ago in the wake of the Jimmy Savile scandal.

Channel 4’s The Accused: National Treasures On Trial will focus on the impact the process had on the three stars, their careers and reputations.

Video diaries recorded with radio DJs Gambaccini and Fox at the time will offer further insight into their immediate thoughts during the investigations.

The documentary will also reflect on the operation’s wider legacy through their eyes and

the lasting impact it has had on the country’s values, attitudes and culture.

Some of those close to the police investigation, along with journalists who were involved in the national conversation surrounding Yewtree, will also feature.

Sir Cliff, 81, won a privacy case against the BBC over its coverage of a South Yorkshire Police raid on his home in Berkshire in 2014, Channel 4’s The Accused: National Treasures On Trial will focus on the impact the process had on the three stars, their careers and reputations.

The veteran singer denied the allegations, he was never arrested and in June 2016 prosecutors announced that he would face no charges.

Gambaccini was arrested in October 2013 as part of Operation Yewtree over a claim he sexually assaulted two teenage boys.

The 73-year-old, a regular fixture on the airwaves for decades,

spent a year on bail before the case was dropped.

Former Capital FM presenter Fox, 61, was accused of eight counts of indecent assault and two of sexual assault dating back to the late 1980s, involving young fans and colleagues.

He was cleared of all 10 counts at Westminster magistrates’ court in December 2015.

Sir Cliff and Gambaccini have since launched a campaign calling for suspects to have their anonymity protected by law unless they are charged.

Lee McMurray, commissioning editor of factual entertainment at Channel 4, said: “This film offers a unique and fresh take on events that changed us forever, compelling viewers to ask important questions about a watershed moment in recent British history.”

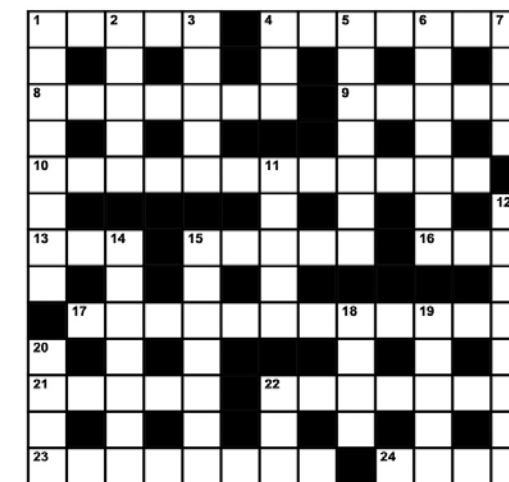

Di death theories examined in upcoming TV documentary

SEVERAL conspiracy theories around the death of Diana, Princess of Wales – and the twin police investigations – will be explored in a new documentary.

The Princess was 36 when she was killed in a car crash in Paris on August 31, 1997.

Channel 4’s Investigating Diana: Death In Paris will recount the dual inquiries into the incident – the first by the French in 1997, the second by London’s Met Police in 2004.

It will feature interviews with officers from both forces.

A co-production between Channel 4 and Discovery Plus, the story will explore “how powerful individuals, the press and the internet created and fuelled conspiracy theories that overwhelmed facts and called into question the very nature of truth”.

BEING booed at half-time and slipping to a humiliating opening-day defeat was not what Erik ten Hag will have dreamt of for his Premier League debut.

A better second-half show saw United halve the deficit as Alexis Mac Allister bundled in an own goal. But this, against a team who lost two of their best players in the close season, was not the performance of a team capable of mounting a challenge for Champions League football.

Jadon Sancho and Marcus Rashford were poor, Scott McTominay and Fred limited in midfield and Harry Maguire and Lisandro Martinez looked far from impregnable as a new partnership in central defence. In truth, all the best players were wearing

Werner heading back to Leipzig

Blues big exodus set to continue

TIMO WERNER is expected to lead a Chelsea exodus after sealing a £25million return to RB Leipzig.

The Blues flop, a £47.5m signing from the Bundesliga club in 2020, was set for a medical on Thursday. Werner was initially leaving on a season-long loan with an option to buy but an agreement has now been reached for the 26-year-old to exit permanently.

The German is the second big-name striker Chelsea's new
