“Unthinkable”: Harry steps down from Diana charity

■ Duke walks away from his beloved Sentebale after board’s chair refuses to go quietly

■ Charity head returns fire with allegations of “bullying, harassment and misogyny”

PRINCE HARRY was in the news for all the wrong reasons again this week as he made the ‘unthinkable decision’ the step down from the charity he co-founded in honor of his late mother two decades ago.

Making a joint statement on Wednesday with Prince Seeiso of Lesotho, with whom he founded the Sentebale charity, Harry said the pair had decided to stand down as patrons over the “untenable” leadership of Dr Sophie Chandauka, the chair of the African charity’s board.

The trustees had recently asked Dr Chandauka to step down from her position, which prompted her to report them to the Charity Commission in the U.K. and file papers in London’s High Court to prevent her removal.

‘devastating’

Harry described his own decision as ‘unthinkable’ but added: “Our commitment to supporting youth in southern Africa with better health, stronger livelihoods and climate resilience remains as

strong as ever. The work continues because they deserve nothing less.

“It is devastating that the relationship between the charity’s trustees and the chair of the board broke down beyond repair, creating an untenable situation,” the princes said. “These trustees acted in the best interest of the charity in asking the chair to step down, while keeping the well-being of staff in mind. In turn, she sued the charity to remain in this voluntary position, further underscoring the broken relationship.”

“What’s transpired is unthinkable. We are in shock that we have to do this, but we have a continued responsibility to Sentebale’s beneficiaries, so we will be sharing all of our concerns with the Charity Commission as to how this came about,” Harry and Seeiso said.

“Although we may no longer be patrons, we

will always be its founders, and we will never forget what this charity is capable of achieving when it is in the right care.”

Chandauka quickly returned fire, unleashing an eye-watering attack in which she made little effort to hide her scorn for the youngest son of King Charles.

“victim narrative”

“There are people in this world who behave as though they are above the law and mistreat people, and then play the victim card and use the very press they disdain to harm people who have the courage to challenge their conduct,” she wrote.

“Beneath all the victim narrative and fiction that has been syndicated to the press is the story of a woman who dared to blow the whistle about issues of poor governance, weak executive

management, abuse of power, bullying, harassment, misogyny, misogynoir [misogyny directed towards black women] and the cover-up that ensued.”

Over a 20-year career, Chandauka has worked for some of the world’s biggest companies, including Meta, Morgan Stanley and the Virgin Group. She inherited a successful charity but one that some concede had become reliant on the annual Sentebale polo cup and a certain section of society dipping into their pockets.

According to one account, the charity survived the financial fallout of the Covid pandemic largely thanks to

STARMER: We need to tighten the screw on Russia

■ PM calls for resolution among allies, accusing Putin of “playing games and playing for time”

Western sanctions on Russia need to be increased, not weakened, in order to bring it to the negotiating table, Sir Keir Starmer has said.

Speaking on Thursday, the prime minister accused Vladimir Putin of “playing games and playing for time” after the Russian president demanded sanctions were lifted before a US-brokered maritime ceasefire is enacted.

“Now is not the time for pulling back or weakening sanctions - now is the time to increase sanctions to get them to the table,” Starmer said in Paris, where he is meeting European leaders.

French President Emmanuel Macron, co-hosting Thursday’s so-called “coalition of the willing” summit, has suggested a European reassurance force could “respond” if attacked by Moscow.

‘strong and united’

Starmer said on Thursday a “framework and a deadline” was needed for Ukraine peace talks.

He said he had agreed with partners at the summit, which hosted representatives from 30 nations as well as the European Union and Nato, that “we must go further now to support the

peace process, support Ukraine and increase the pressure on Russia to get serious”.

“It means increasing the economic pressure on Russia, accelerating new tougher sanctions, bearing down on Russia’s energy revenues, and working together to make this pressure count,” he said.

Starmer said that the political mood to find a just and lasting peace in Ukraine was “stronger and broader” than it had ever been, adding that “Europe as a whole has not been this strong and united in a long time”.

The UK will chair the next meeting of the Ukraine Defense Contact group, comprised of dozens of countries, to deliver further military aid and “keep Ukraine in the fight”, Starmer said.

The prime minister said defence chiefs from the UK, France and Germany would also be meeting in Ukraine, but did not specify a date.

Speaking with Ukraine’s President Zelensky earlier, Starmer accused Russia of “continuing to inflict devastating attacks on the Ukrainian people” and said Putin’s promises were “hollow”.

Zelensky said that ev-

erybody at the meeting understood “that Russia doesn’t want any kind of peace”, and that they would discuss security guarantees in the coming weeks and days.

Russia and Ukraine have accused each other of breaking the terms of a separate, tentative deal to pause strikes on energy infrastructure.

Russian demands

Washington announced the Black Sea deal had been agreed on Tuesday, after holding separate talks with delegations from Ukraine and Russia in Saudi Arabia.

But just hours later, the Kremlin said it would not take effect until sanctions were lifted on Russian banks, producers and exporters involved in the international food and fertiliser trades.

Moscow’s demands include reconnecting Russian banks involved in the agrifood trade to the Swift payment system, lifting restrictions on servicing ships under the Russian flag involved in the food trade, and revoking sanctions on the supply of agricultural machinery and other goods involved in food production.

Macron confirmed that

European countries had “unanimously agreed” that sanctions against Moscow should not be lifted.

“The time is not ripe to lift sanctions... We need to keep economic pressure up,” he said.

The UK and France are leading efforts to send a force to Ukraine to deter any future Russian aggression in the event of a ceasefire.

European leaders put on a show of unity in Paris. In reality many have already ruled out send-

ing troops to Ukraine.

Countries including Finland and Poland feel under direct threat from Russia and feel their troops need to protect their own borders. Others fear deploying soldiers would be a deeply unpopular decision at home.

Italy’s Prime Minister Giorgia Meloni – who has repeatedly expressed her scepticism at the Franco-British plan – has been working to put forward an “alternative” option which would see

soldiers serve in Ukraine exclusively as part of a United Nations military contingent.

So far British efforts to build a coalition have found scorn among American leaders, with Steve Witkoff – who is leading the US ceasefire negotiations with Ukraine and Russia – describing the prime minister’s ideas as ‘posture and pose’ and accused him of adopting the ‘simplistic notion’ that leaders ‘have all got to be like Winston Churchill’.

Headed to the UK? don’t forget your UK passport

LOCAL expats who have taken American citizenship and are planning to visit the UK this summer: don’t forget your British passport.

Thanks to the Electronic Travel Authorization (ETA) law which came into effect on January 8th, even those with dual UK/USA citizenship will be required to have an ETA if they are only traveling with their US passport.

If you are traveling on your British or Irish passport, however, an ETA is NOT needed.

The new law requires all those traveling on US passports, regardless of country of origin, to have



an ETA to travel to the UK for short stays, tourism, business, or short-term study, unless they have a UK visa or other immigration status.

Those transiting through the UK to other European or global destinations (but not going through any immigration /border patrol) do not need an ETA, no do permanent residents of the UK who already have permission to live, work or study in the UK.

The simplest way to apply is through the UK ETA app on your smartphone. The cost is £10 Cost: The ETA costs £10 (about \$13) and is valid for two years or until your passport expires, whichever comes first.

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Isle Of Man becomes first place in British Isles to legalize assisted dying

THE Isle of Man has become the first place in the British Isles to legalise assisted dying, after a landmark bill passed its final parliamentary vote.

After years of debate, scrutiny and amendments, the island's Legislative Council voted to approve the final changes, meaning the bill will now go for Royal Assent.

Isle of Man campaigner Millie Blenkinsop-French, 81, said she was "over the moon" that others would not have to suffer the "horrific death" her son endured.

James, 51, had been diagnosed with squamous cell carcinoma after finding a pea-sized lump in his neck.

The cancer ate away at his body, leaving him in unbearable pain. Assisted dying will be legalised for terminally ill, mentally competent adults who are expected to die within one year, and who have been resident on the island for at least five years.

Millie has supported such a change for decades and became a member of the Voluntary Euthanasia Society,

which later became Dignity in Dying.

Asked how she felt about the change, she said: "Over the moon because there are a lot of people out there, even as we're talking now, going through the agony that my son went through.

"The sooner [the bill] gets through, the better, for a lot of people. It will stop a lot of suffering and give people a choice they're entitled to have."

Millie believes the rest of the British Isles will follow the island's example, adding: "After all, the Isle of Man was

the first to give women the vote. So here it goes again."

Labour MP Kim Leadbeater's Assisted Dying Bill is currently going

through Parliament in a bid to change the law in England and Wales.

Americans apply for British passports in record numbers

Americans applied for British citizenship in record numbers last year, with a historically high volume of applications submitted in the last quarter of 2024 – a period coinciding with US President Donald Trump's re-election.

More than 6,100 US citizens applied for UK citizenship last year, the most since records began in 2004, when fewer than 3,000 Americans submitted an application, according to data from the Home Office.

Last year's numbers also saw a marked uptick from 2023, a year with fewer than 5,000 applications by US citizens.

Applications by Americans soared in the last three months of 2024, when more than 1,700 people applied – the most in any quarter in the past two decades.

The surge is reminiscent of an upswing recorded in the first six months of 2020, when more than 5,800 Americans gave up their citizenship, nearly tripling the number from all of 2019.

That uptick came in the wake of Trump's first

presidency and changes in tax policy, analysts argued then, and were mostly Americans who had already been living in Britain for some time.

While many people who renounced their citizenship complained of being unhappy with the political climate in the US, another reason for their decision is often taxes, Alistair Bambridge, a partner at Bambridge Accountants, said in August 2020.

Trump himself could apply for British citizenship, through his late mother, Mary Anne MacLeod, who was born and raised in Scotland before leaving as a 17-year-old for the United States to work as a domestic servant in 1930.

As more Americans scramble for UK passports, some Brits citizens have recently sought their own backups.

In the years following the UK's vote to leave the European Union (EU) in 2016, the number of Britons applying for Irish passports – giving them the right to freely work, live and travel across Europe – almost doubled.

Tributes flow as Andy Peebles, Radio 1 Legend, dies At 76

Radio 1 legend Andy Peebles has died at the age of 76.

The DJ was on the network between 1978 and 1992 and also presented Top of the Pops and co-hosted Live Aid.

He was also one of the last people to interview John Lennon. Andy's former workmate Mike Read, 78, said: "Devastated to hear about our chum Andy Peebles. We joined Radio 1 together. Knew his music and cricket inside out.

"Raise your bat and enjoy a long rest in the pavilion."

Andy's friend and radio

executive John Simons said: "So sad to hear the news about Andy Peebles passing. I'll miss our long conversations about football and soul music, of which he was far more knowledgeable. There's going to be a Quiet Storm in heaven tonight. RIP Andy."

Andy interviewed John Lennon and Yoko Ono two days before the ex-Beatle was assassinated by Mark David Chapman in New York in December 1980. He stayed friends with Yoko.

Speaking to CBS in 2020, Andy said of the Lennon interview: "I don't think

I've ever been so nervous in my life and I'd grown up not just idolising him but the group and everything they'd done."

He began his radio ca-

reer in 1973 at BBC Radio Manchester before going on to found Piccadilly Radio in the city.

His last TV appearance was on CBS in 2020.

Chandauka "wanted to do it differently", said a source. It is understood that a decision was made to hire the "women-led strategy firm" Lebec at a significant cost. This led to a shift of the charity's leadership away from London to southern Africa. Fundraising efforts

would also now be focused more on the west coast of the US than the shires, according to one source.

Insiders who have worked in Sentebale said they could understand the move away from "a bunch of white blokes". It was also one that chimed with the wider thinking in Africa about the role of western charities.

Sentebale, which means "don't forget me" in the Sesotho language

of Lesotho and South Africa, was initially focused on helping children and young people affected by AIDS in the small mountainous nation of Lesotho and Botswana.

'it's worth it'

Sentebale said in a statement it was evolving into an organization that addresses larger issues of youth health, wealth and climate resilience in southern Africa. It said it has not received

resignations from its royal patrons.

Harry co-founded the charity after he spent time working at an orphanage in Lesotho during a gap year. He last visited Sentebale in Lesotho in October, when he spoke with young people and others connected to the charity.

He told them: "You might not always realize how significant your influence is, but if it changes even one person's life, it's worth it."

Beeb pulls plug on live Blue Peter

BLUE Peter, Britain's longest running children's TV show, has recorded its final live episode in a change described as "the end of an era".

As it tries to reflect new audience viewing habits the programme will go out as pre-recorded episodes online.

The move is said to have come as a surprise to some of the current crew, as well as to past presenters.

Simon Thomas, who co-hosted the BBC1 programme from 1999 to 2005, said: "We probably didn't realise it at the time, but we were working in the last years of the golden age of children's TV. An era when audiences were measured in the millions rather than the thousands."

Countryfile's Matt Baker, a presenter at around the same time, said: "The best memories and the end of the most magical energy and spirit."

And Richard Bacon, who was sacked from the show in 1998 after taking cocaine, said the live element was what made Blue Peter "alive".

He added: "The elephant, the studio catching fire. The mistakes, the movement, the energy."

Blue Peter began in October 1958 and in its heyday aired three times a week on BBC1.

Famous mishaps included Lulu the baby elephant pooping on the studio floor and Shep the dog joining in Roy Castle's drumming display.

In future it will be available on CBBC, Sign Zone, BBC2 and iPlayer.

A BBC spokesperson said: "The programme has been a mix of live and pre-recorded shows for decades and has transitioned to a pre-record model as viewing habits change."

Norfolk villagers get on the line to save 'vital' phone box

■ People power comes through as BT abandon plan to cut off pay phone in rural village

A phone box described as a "lifeline" which was used fewer than 10 times last year has been saved from being disconnected.

In October, telecommunications company BT announced it would close the phone box in Sharrington, near Holt in Norfolk.

However, villagers held an event to drive up the number of calls, with 146 calls made in total - almost three times the number needed to save it.

North Norfolk MP Stefan Aquarone said: "It just goes to show you that communities can achieve incredible things when we stand together to protect what matters to us."

On Friday 14 March, villagers queued at the phone box in a bid to increase the amount of calls made from it.

Guidelines say a minimum of 52 calls have to be made from the box each

year in order for it to remain in service.

People had pleaded with the company to retain the phone box in 2016.

Villagers including Derek Harris have been campaigning to save the phone box. He said the news was a "tremendous victory for common sense".

Mr Harris said the phone had been used for a 999 call by people who lived nearby, and in the past couple of weeks had been used by an ambulance driver who could not get a mobile phone signal in the village.

He said: "I am so proud of our community for coming together to save our emergency lifeline and for standing up to preserve something so important to us."

"It means everything to me to know that the phone box will still be

here long after I'm gone."

Mr Aquarone said: "The K6 phone box is a lifeline in this small, rural village and, when BT said they were planning to remove it, the whole of Sharrington stood up and said 'absolutely not'."

"It is so heartening to know that the Sharrington phone box sign will continue to light up in this small, rural corner of North Norfolk for many evenings to come, with

many more conversations still to be had down its crackling phone line."

Speaking to BBC Radio Norfolk, he said it was a "massive win" for rural communities across Norfolk and he believes the box will be used even more after the campaign.

"This is a great story of a community standing up to a large corporation and a large corporation doing the right thing."

Mr Aquarone empha-

sised how the service was needed for public safety and had been used during emergencies.

A representative for BT confirmed it had decided not to remove the phone.

It said: "This decision was made due to the poor mobile phone signal in the area and the significant number of calls made from the payphone, highlighting its importance to the community."

Stranded turtle the latest victim of Trump cuts

A rare turtle stranded on the Welsh coast faces an unexpected obstacle to getting home - US President Donald Trump.

Rhossi washed up on Anglesey at the end of 2023 and has been slowly nursed back to health.

The Kemp's Ridley Sea Turtle is now fighting fit, and Anglesey Sea Zoo said Rhossi was ready to be released back into the wild off the coast of the US.

However, executive orders signed in the White House means international marine turtle conservation work is on hold for now, leaving Rhossi in limbo.

In January, President Trump pressed pause on all foreign development assistance for at least three months.

In response, the federal conservation body, the US Fish and Wildlife Service (USFWS), froze funding for several or-

ganisations, ordering some of the work it oversees to stop.

It included the work of the Marine Turtle Conservation Fund, which along with the wildlife service and other agencies, had been the key contacts for getting Rhossi home and then released into the Gulf of Mexico.

Then in February, more than 400 employees at the USFWS lost their jobs as part of President Trump's efforts to shrink the size of the federal government's workforce.

Rhossi is the second Kemp's ridley sea turtle Anglesey Sea Zoo has rescued, successfully repatriating one called Tally to Texas before it was released back into the wild in 2023.

"It is a huge problem - it's very frustrating," said Frankie Hobro, the owner and director of

"Animal species don't understand politics, they don't understand boundaries and borders."

"We'd started to get a really successful repatriation regime in place."

"We thought we had things so they were running quite smoothly. We were going to fine-tune the process for future turtles."

"It's very, very frustrating that's been put on hold now really because of politics and this kind of sweeping decision and the far reaching affect it is having way beyond the states."

The former director of USFWS said the impact on conservation projects was "heartbreaking".

"I didn't expect this administration to nec-

essarily be friendly towards conservation. I have been surprised at the speed and the degree to which they have undermined decades of goodwill and work in the conservation sphere," said Martha Williams.

She described the cuts to promised funding for projects such as marine turtle conservation as "cruel".

Man who stole 325 Creme Eggs banned from Cambridgeshire for three months

■ Deon De Groot, 26, was spotted stuffing eggs worth £220.50 into a duffel bag at a Tesco Express in Peterborough

A man who stole 325 Cadbury Creme Eggs from a petrol station has been banned from Cambridgeshire for three months.

Deon De Groot, 26, was spotted when he stuffed £220.50 worth of the eggs into a duffel bag at a Tesco Express in Dogsthorpe, Peterborough, and left without paying on Saturday.

A member of staff flagged down officers in a passing police car, who followed De Groot.

Police found he had a significant amount of the stolen goods concealed within his jacket but had dropped the duffel bag nearby – which was also full of boxes of Creme

Eggs.

De Groot, of no fixed address, appeared at Peterborough magistrates court on Tuesday, where he was sentenced to 12 weeks in prison, suspended for a year.

He was also banned from entering Cambridgeshire for the next three months after admitting theft from a shop.

PC Guy Cunningham, who made the arrest, said: "Thanks to the quick reaction by staff who flagged us down, we were able to catch De Groot red-handed and return the stolen items to the store."

Cambridgeshire police released bodycam

footage showing officers noticing a suspicious bulge under his jacket prior to his arrest.

Cunningham can be heard saying: "Hey, hey, hey, hey. Hands out. Hang on a sec. I'm going to put handcuffs on you, all right. You're under arrest on suspicion of theft from a shop, all right. Because, I mean, Christ, what have you got in there?"

De Groot replies "Creme Eggs" and the officer begins unzipping the shoplifter's jacket. De Groot offers no resistance apart from saying "It's all gonna fall out."

The officer pulls the boxes from his coat, telling the thief: "Christ,

you've really loaded this up."

Being banned from an area is a punishment typically handed down to prolific offenders under criminal behaviour orders (CBOs), which replaced asbos.

CBOs are imposed by a court and can restrict where an offender goes,

who they associate with, and what activities they are allowed to take part in. Breaching the order is a criminal offence, which can lead to a prison sentence.

Earlier this month, a thief who stole £120 worth of Easter eggs was jailed and banned from Co-op stores across Not-

tinghamshire.

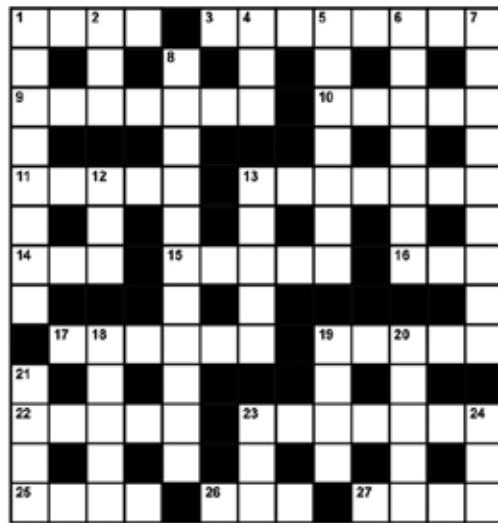
Adam Hadfield, 38, was handed a CBO that also bans him from shops and supermarkets in Clifton and West Bridgford for two years.

He was jailed at Nottingham magistrates court for 36 weeks and ordered to pay £220 in compensation.

Barton, 42, pushed his wife to the ground before kicking her in the head.

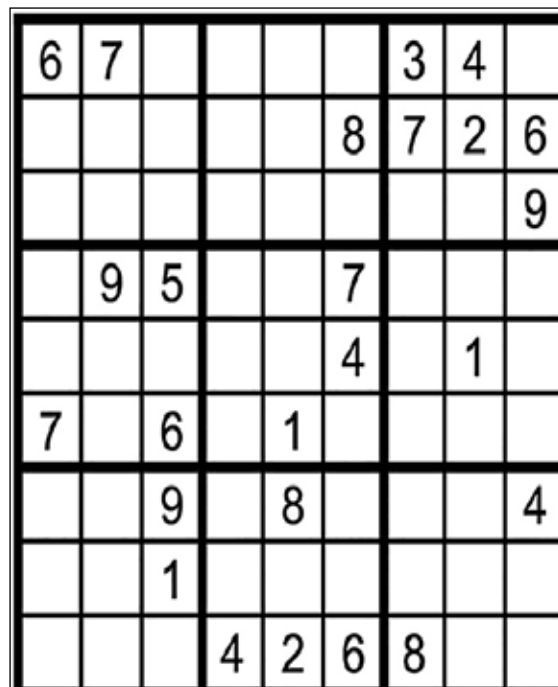
Georgia called police, saying her husband had "just hit me" but later retracted her allegations.

At Westminster Magistrates' Court chief magistrate Paul Goldspring convicted Barton of a single charge of assault by beating.

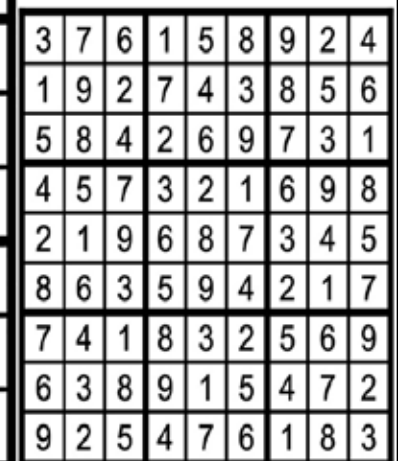
He was given a 12-week jail sentence, suspended for two years so he will not do time.

GANGS OF LONDON: Gory, violent, completely OTT (but we kinda like it)

■ British drama pulls back the curtain on the capital's teeming, vibrant and multicultural criminal underworld

OVER IN the UK Season Three of the popular TV drama *Gangs of London* has just dropped, but no word yet on when this addictive British import will be available on these shores.

Since the show debuted in 2020 US viewers have been able to enjoy the complex and brutal drama set in London's underworld, where various criminal factions vie for power, control, and survival on AMC+ and more recently, Netflix.

But for the uninitiated, this week we take a look at the acclaimed show's history and backstory, hopefully whetting your appetite for a binge-watch while we wait for the next installments.

The show's first episode opens with the assassination of



Finn Wallace (Colm Meaney), the head of the powerful Wallace crime family, in a seedy London tower block by a hapless local teen from a Traveller family, who has been duped into thinking he is killing a notorious local pedophile.

Wallace's death sends shockwaves through the city and its criminal underworld, with Finn's eldest son Sean (Joe Cole) channeling his best Sonny Corleone as he thrashes around to find the culprit. Other members of the family, lead by consigliere Ed Dumani (Lucian Msama-

ti) counsel caution, while Finn's former associates in London's Kurdish, Turkish and Albanian gangs jostle to move into the vacuum left by Finn's departure.

Meanwhile a police undercover officer posing as a rising enforcer within the family, Elliot Finch (Sope Dirisu) is also keen to make his mark, if only to build enough evidence to take the family down.

Amid the murder, gore and mayhem which follows Wallace's death, there's plenty of strong women on stage too, including Michelle Fairlie as Finn's wife, Marian, who quickly learns there was more to her husband's private life than she could ever have imagined, while Albanian drug queen Lale (Narges Rashidi) proves herself as deadly as the male... whenever she needs to and often when she does not.

Season One explores themes of loyalty, ambition, and betrayal, with intense action and violence as the Wallace family close in on their patriarch's killer while doing their best to control their far-flung empire. Inevitably rash choices made within the family bring unexpected consequences, and as Season Two arrives it ups the ante with the rise of dangerous players entering the ring, including the arrival of a mysterious organization called "The Investors," who have vast global influence

Ethan Nwaneri scored on his full debut as England Under-21s beat Portugal in an entertaining friendly at The Hawthorns in midweek.

Midfielder Hayden Hackney fired the hosts in front before Nwaneri, who turned 18 on Friday, curled the ball into the bottom corner from the edge of the box to double the lead after just 10 minutes.

Portugal had come close while it was still goalless and pulled one back through captain Fabio Silva, who tucked away Rodrigo Pinheiro's cross from close range midway through the first half.

The visitors could have been level at the break but Pedro Santos' shot came back off the post moments after Silva felt he had been taken out by England goalkeeper James Beadle.

Both sides had chances after the break but it took until the 76th minute for the next goal to arrive as Omari Hutchinson nodded in from close range to extend England's lead.

Portugal hit back once more, though, with Carlos Forbs stabbing home five minutes from time after his initial shot had been blocked.

The visitors pushed for an equaliser but Jaden Philogene sealed the win for Lee Carsley's side in stoppage time with a cool finish at the end of a swift counter-attack.

Carsley made a number of changes to his line-up in this international window as he assesses his options before the European Under-21 Championship.

The results have certainly been entertaining with England scoring and conceding seven goals across their two games against France and Portugal.

Brooks happy to bail out Allen

David Brooks says Wales were delighted to bail out Joe Allen after the veteran midfielder's error looked set to condemn Craig Bellamy's side to defeat in North Macedonia.

Wales were staring at the first loss of the Bellamy era after Allen's wayward pass teed up Bojan Miovski to give North Macedonia a 91st-minute lead in Skopje on Tuesday night.

But in an extraordinary climax to the game, Brooks scrambled home from fellow substitute Kieffer Moore's knockdown in the sixth minute of added time to ensure Wales claimed a World Cup qualifying point.

"Joe made the mistake and he's a Welsh legend," said Bournemouth midfielder Brooks.

"So everyone wanted to pull through to help him out. Thankfully it was me that managed to stick it in the net."

Allen, who turned 35

earlier this month, came out of international retirement earlier this year to play for Bellamy.

The Swansea City player had only been on the pitch seven minutes when his uncharacteristic mistake looked to have cost Wales any hope of a positive result.

But Wales had been the better side for much of the contest and deservedly came away with something courtesy of Brooks' dramatic late intervention.

"Anyone can make a mistake and it's unfortunate that he (Miovski) has slotted it home – [Karl] Darlow got a good leg to it but it trickled in," Brooks added.

"Joe is probably one of the best players we've ever had and you don't expect it from him.

"But like the gaffer said afterwards, the reaction to get on the ball, keep moving and progress us up the pitch to get the chance shows the character and

how well liked he is in our dressing room."

"As soon as that goal went in there were no heads down – Joe's head would have been down a little – but everyone wanted to get him out. We had that belief that we could go and get an equaliser."

Formula One: McLaren one-two as Piastri throws down gauntlet to Lando

OSCAR PIASTRI declared victory in Shanghai as the start of his title charge as he warned McLaren team-mate Lando Norris he will not go down without a fight.

Norris survived failing brakes to finish second, securing the team's 50th one-two finish in Formula One and retaining his place at the top of the drivers' standings.

But Australian Piastri, who has Chinese heritage, proved he will be a tough obstacle for his team-mate with an assured win from pole.

Asked if his third career Grand Prix victory was the start of his title campaign, Piastri smiled and said: "I hope so!"

The 23-year-old is 10 points behind Norris and the gap would have

been much smaller had he not slipped off track while chasing the win in the season-opener in Melbourne seven days earlier.

Piastri said: "It's amazing how things change in a week. It's been a great weekend all around.

"It's not been as straightforward as it was in Australia. It's been difficult, but we did a good job of turning the car around.

"It's clearly been fast but we had to make it easier to get a handle on and we did a really good job. I've had a strong weekend personally as well."

Norris rued that he never got the chance to pile the pressure on his team-mate in the closing stages.

Instead, the Brit was

more concerned with simply finishing the race after McLaren warned him late on his brakes were getting worse. Norris, 25, said: "The last five, six, seven, eight laps were pretty horrible.

"Try going around a roundabout without braking and you'll get a feeling of what that's like. I don't advise that! It's not nice.

"We were lucky to finish. It's just the worst feeling when you press the brakes and nothing happens, your foot just goes to the floor.

"I had just enough to finish but just one or two more laps and I don't think I would have."

The Brit said: "We know we're not quite in that fight and P3s are the maximum.

"I was driving with full gas. Half a lap [more and] I would have passed him [Norris], but I think he knew the gap and he managed it well. I'm happy with that result."

World champion Max Verstappen was unusually quiet in fourth as Red Bull continue to underwhelm, while team-mate Liam Lawson again finished pointless and could be dropped as

early as the next round in Japan.

Despite back-to-back podiums, Russell – who qualified second – was reluctant to declare Mercedes the next-quickest team behind McLaren.

He added: "Had qualifying not been as strong, I wouldn't have finished on the podium."

Oliver Bearman finished eighth for Haas to make it three Brits in the top 10, despite Lewis Hamilton's disqualification after his ride height was found to be too low. Bearman, 19, said: "We did a great job."

Extra transfer window added

The Premier League has announced it will have two transfer windows this summer to allow Manchester City and Chelsea to sign players before the Club World Cup.

The window will open between Sunday, 1 June and Tuesday, 10 June, then close for five days before running again from Monday, 16 June until Monday, 1 September.

This summer features the first expanded Fifa Club World Cup, which involves 32 teams and adopts the format of the regular World Cup of the past few years.

Chelsea and Manchester City are the Premier League teams in

the tournament which takes place in the United States from Sunday, 15 June.

But the Premier League can only have 12 weeks of a summer window - hence the five-day break in order to run it until 1 September.

Fifa has allowed new players to be registered for the Club World Cup from 1-10 June, and again from 27 June-3 July for the knockout stage.

This is being done to bring order to the global registration system. FIFA only permits the transfer window in any individual country to be open for 16 weeks in any calendar year.

In Europe, precedent dictates four of those

weeks are for the winter window, leaving 12 in the summer. In 2024, the Premier League transfer window opened on 14 June and closed on 30 August.

However, in October, Fifa approved an additional window from 1-10 June that would allow the 32 clubs competing in the Club World Cup to register new players before the tournament.

It also agreed to open a registration window mid-tournament, from 27 June and 3 July, to allow clubs to register additional players for the knockout stage.

As well as Manchester City and Chelsea, European heavyweights Real Madrid, Atletico Ma-

drid, Inter Milan, Juventus, Paris St-Germain, Bayern Munich, Borussia Dortmund and Saudi Arabia's Al-Hilal are among others playing in the tournament.

In order to ensure

Manchester City and Chelsea did not have an advantage over the other 18 top-flight clubs, the Premier League has adopted the same window.

The Champions League final takes place

in Munich on 31 May. After that, there are Nations League semi-finals and finals and World Cup qualifying double-headers. In Europe, those games take place 6-10 June.

It's dubious as to whether Tucher got much else out of the night, Eze's first goal notwithstanding. The new manager might instead be realizing just how thankless a lot of international football can be.
